List of Local Grants: Note — You can put together multiple smaller grants to reach the amount of funding that you need by going to more than one funding sources. Here are some examples:

60. ***Hospital Foundations:** *By federal law, all hospitals must have a foundation. All foundations must donate to community in their service area health. All foundations have boards and board meeting. Ask to be on the agenda to present to the board with your powerpoint presentation. Ask that the board visit your school physical education program.*
61. ***County Health Departments:** *Check with them to see what funding opportunities are available. Illinois County Health Departments have provided money in the past (East Aurora School District 131, example).*
62. ***State Health Department:** *Check with your state requirements and opportunities*
***Dick's Sporting Goods:** *They offer in their local communities \$1,000 grant program.*
63. ***Girl Scouts:** *The local chapter did a fund raiser for the Cherry Creek Title 1 school and raised \$1,000 towards the purchase of a Heart Zones Move System.*
64. ***Private Family Foundation:** *Check out if there are a type of charity set up by a family, funded with the family's assets and often run by family members who can also participate in charitable grant-making. Do a web search to find your local ones.*
65. ***Local Service Organizations:** *Contact your local Soroptimist, Lions Club, Rotary, American Heart Association Chapter.*

 - **School Board:** Make a presentation using the Heart Zones Funding Template for a presentation and request for funding to your local school board.
 - **School Principal's Budget:** Some principals have a "discretionary" budget that they can use for special projects and events. Often this has to be used for a equipment or Smart PE Certification professional development purchase. Ask your principal for funding out of the "technology" budget not the "PE" budget.
